Mackie Academy Senior Phase Career and Learner Pathways Event 2019 is a two day event designed to **support** you as you move through the Senior Phase of Curriculum for Excellence and consider the **pathways** you will follow as you move into **further and higher education, apprenticeships** and the **world of work**. The event is designed to equip you with the **practical skills** you require to be **successful** in your studies; to **support** you as you face the **emotional and personal challenges** of the Senior Phase; and to provide you with the information you need to be **fully informed** in the **choices** you begin to consider as you look towards **life beyond school**.



This booklet is designed to help you make **informed choices** about the sessions you will attend during the Senior Phase Induction event. The event has been designed in such a way that you have completely **free choice** about which sessions you

attend, so that the induction days are **a bespoke experience** for you, tailored to **meet your individual needs**.

Signing Up

- Before signing up, please consider all of the options and where your choices fit best together across the two day programme.

Session Descriptions

Tree of Knowledge ***"Reach for the Power"***

We all have power, the power to choose how we see the world and the path that we take. Why is it then that we choose to only see difficulty when there is opportunity? And why is it we choose to be bored or to follow a path that we do not enjoy? These are questions tackled in 'Reach for the Power', challenging you to think differently in order to see your opportunities and more importantly take them. We have a bad habit of copying each other because it's safe. This course questions this habit; opening your eyes to aspire to a career you love instead of a job for money.

Tree of Knowledge ***"Intriguing Futures"***

Intriguing Futures actively motivates you to lead the session in preparation for the leadership you will apply not only in school, but in your own lives as well. *Intriguing Futures* is designed to allow you to embrace and overcome personal challenges towards leadership, unlocking confidence in your abilities thus relishing your responsibilities. This

course leaves you feeling empowered, ready to lead yourselves into your very own Intriguing Future.

Mindfulness

Worried about getting to grips with the next stage of Senior Phase? Or perhaps needing to find some space in your busy timetable, just for you? Then try our Mindfulness Taster! You'll come away with an idea of what Mindfulness is all about, find out how mindless you might be, along with tips for making sure you stay healthy! At the very least you'll have time to yourself with absolutely nothing to do apart from relax! Interested? Curious? We'd be delighted to meet you!

Preparing for Life as a Student

Think you know what student life is about? This session will be led by a current university student and former pupil Kelsey Stewart who was this year's Prize Giving guest speaker. Kelsey will share her experiences of student life with you, allowing you to learn from her mistakes, give key tips for becoming a successful student, and finding that perfect balance between study and leisure time!

Introduction to Understanding Mental Health - Looking After Yourself and Others

Come along to get a brief overview of what you could experience when attending the Scottish Mental Health First Aid course, as well as a better understanding of how this qualification could be useful in a range of work settings. You should hopefully leave the session knowing what mental health means, an understanding of signs and symptoms of depression and anxiety, and some self-care strategies to help you get the best you can in life.

Personal Statements & UCAS

Looking forward to life after school, your Personal Statement and UCAS form will be crucial documents for further and higher education and for the world of work. Pathways through Student Life

Three new teachers share their experiences juggling studies, part time jobs, student night-life - A real life synopsis of what really happens at college and uni, expectations versus reality and things they wish they knew before embarking on this journey.

Gap Years

Clueless as to what you want to do with your life? Find your passion, gain experience and learn new things about the world and yourself by taking a gap year.

Presentation Skills

Great presentation skills are crucial to success in the Senior Phase in learning across the curriculum, as well as in the world of work. In this session, through an interactive workshop, you will learn to improve your skills and build your confidence in order to be able to approach all Senior Phase presentations positively.

College as a Post School Pathway

This session will provide you with information about the options available to you at college and how these can lead to further pathways and choices beyond college itself. Come along for the opportunity to talk to a representative from NESCOL and have your questions answered.

Recruitment & Promoting Yourself Positively

Recruitment (hiring) refers to the overall process of attracting, shortlisting, selecting and appointing suitable candidates for jobs within an organisation. Do you know what each step of this process involves? Are you ready for recruitment? Come along and find out from a representative of Hays Recruitment, the do's and don'ts of selling yourself to an employer.

Oxbridge Applications

This session is for those pupils who are interested in finding out more about how to apply for Oxford and Cambridge Universities. We will cover the application process, admissions test and interview process.

Research, Information Handling and Referencing

As you move through the Senior Phase, these skills will be central to your success in the writing of assignments, folios and other elements of course work. They will also be highly relevant to pupils intending to continue their academic studies at college or university in the future. This session provider has a research Master's Degree and you will have the opportunity to learn how to make research, information handling and referencing work for you in your own particular course of study.

Study, Revision and Learning Styles

Do you know yourself as a learner and know how you learn best? This is an important aspect of success in the Senior Phase, along with taking responsibility for your revision and study. This session will help you to plan revision and study with tips, hints and strategies to improve your experience of the Senior Phase at Mackie Academy.

Creating your digital CV using the Google Suite

Are you about to start applying for jobs or FE places? Come along to this session and learn how to use the GSuite tools to create your own CV which will be uploaded to create a live web-based version. Design your own business cards that contain your details and links to your online CV.

Foundation Apprenticeships

Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs) are an exciting new addition to the range of opportunities available to school pupils about to go into S5 or S6. Each Foundation Apprenticeship has been designed in partnership with industry to make sure that young people get the skills and knowledge they need to support a range of potential progression routes from school. The blended experience of classroom-based study and work based learning will lead to the development of skills essential for the workplace and industry recognised qualifications, set at SCQF Level 6 (the same level of learning as a Higher).

Beauty & Make Up Artistry

Research is..."Trying to find new information, which will help answer a problem or question." Examples of health research questions might be – Which drug is the best to treat a particular illness? Which is the best way to diagnose a particular disease? Often these questions can't be answered from what we know already, so a new clinical study is needed to answer the question.

- Are you interested in working in health research but not sure what to study?
- Want to hear about clinical trials being run from Aberdeen University?
- Wondered if this is an area you could work in without going to University?
- Want to know what it's like to work in a research department?
- No idea about Health research and what it is, and just want to know more?

Come along and join our session. We'll be telling you a bit about the work we do. There are lots of different ways to play a role in research. There are people with many different backgrounds and experiences.

The session will be run by staff and students from the award winning Health Services Research Unit (www.abdn.ac.uk/hsru) at the University of Aberdeen. We work with NHS teams across the UK to run research projects. Whether it's reducing antibiotic prescribing, developing trauma services for Scotland, running clinical trials or developing clinical guidance, all our research aims to improve healthcare.
